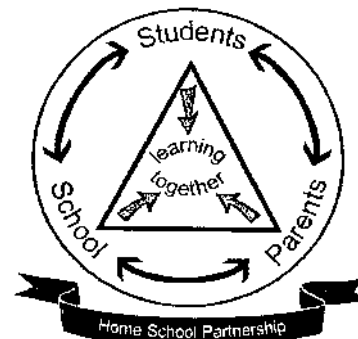

For Students and Parents Our Behavior Policy

Students and parents should be aware that there may be occasions when we may need to impose disciplinary penalties to maintain a safe and orderly learning environment. By necessity we may need to enforce the following sanctions:

- Break time / After School Detentions .
- Confiscation of items eg mobile phones subsequently handed to parents.
- Pupil placed on a signed behaviour contract
- Internal exclusion during the school day.
- Suspension or permanent exclusion from school.
- Very rare occasions may occur where, in the interests of safety or the maintenance of good order, a student's property may be searched on request or the reasonable restraint of a student is required.
